### **Declaration and charge:**

Beloved brethren, we gathered here today before God and this congregation to join this man and this woman in the Holy Matrimony. Marriage is an honourable status ordained by God Himself before the fall of man, and it symbolizes the union between Christ and the Church.

That Christ approves marriage is evident by that fact. He honored an invitation to a wedding in Cana of Galilee and performed His first miracle there. Therefore, marriage should not be rushed to satisfy carnal lust. It has to be approached with dignity and the fear of the Lord.



## Why is there marriage?

**FIRST:** Marriage is for a mutual relationship. This agreement that these two reached is to be joined together.

**SECOND**: Marriage is to check the sinful life of adultery, so those not gifted to be continent can marry and thus themselves holy as the body of Christ.

**THIRD:** Marriage is ordained to bear children who will be nursed to the fear of the Lord, abide by the teaching of His word, and glorify His holy name.

Therefore, from the foregoing, if anybody has any reason(s) why they should not be joined in matrimony, such a person should mention it now. If there is none, let them remain silent on this marriage forever.

#### The officiating minister questions the couple-to-be:

Now both of you should realize that those joined together contrary to the will of God are not acceptably joined together in the sight of the Almighty.

Therefore, do you have reason(s) why you should not be joined together in matrimony?



# \* The officiating minister pauses for their answer:

The man's pledges to the officiating minister.

#### The minister will then ask:

Oluwaseun Adekanmi, do you intend to engage this woman so that you can live together in marriage? Together according to God's order on marriage?

Will you love her, honor her, counsel her, nurse her, in sound health and illness?

Will you leave other women and cleave to her alone as long as both of you are alive?

If the man agrees, he should say:

I WILL.

#### Likewise, the minister will seek the woman's pledge, saying:

Adejumoke Oluwafunmilayo, do you want this man to be your husband so that both of you will live together according to the will of God concerning marriage?

Will you love him, honour him, counsel him, both in the circumstances of plenty and poverty, sound health, and illness? Will you leave other men and cleave to him alone as long as both of you are alive?

If the woman accepts, she should say:

I WILL.



# The officiating minister will ask:

Who gives the woman to be married to this man?

(The father, mother, or any person chosen for the purpose comes forward to give the right hand of the lady to the officiating minister, who in turn hands the lady over to the man.)

#### **Making agreement**

Holding the woman's right hand, the man will pledge: (saying after the minister)

I, Oluwaseun Adekanmi, accept you, Adejumoke Oluwafunmilayo, as my wife from today to have and to hold, for better or worse, in plenty, in poverty, in health and in sickness, I will love you and nurse you according to the will of God till death do us part.

#### After this, the woman declares, saying after the minister:

I, Adejumoke Oluwafunmilayo, accept you, Oluwaseun Adekanmi, as my husband to have and to hold for better or for worse. I will love you in plenty, in poverty, I will nurse and obey you according to the will of God till death do us part.

Then the man gives the woman a new copy of the Holy Bible, and both hold it together, and the husband shall repeat the following after their minister: With this Holy Bible, which is the word of God, I marry you, I surrender myself to you in sacrifice, and I will love and nurse you with all my possessions in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, Amen.

The officiating minister then lays his hand on the couple together and says:

For this cause shall a man leave his father and mother, and cleave to his wife. And the two shall become one flesh. So then, therefore, what God has joined together, let no man put asunder.
